Pennsylvania National Guardsmen Are Dead In Crash Of Two Trains Near Coshocton

Coshocton, O., September 11.—At least 27 Pennsylvania national guard officers said to have been killed and 41 others injured today when the Spoil of St. Louis crashed into the rear of a stalled 20-car troop train near Coshocton.

Eight hours after the crash, the death toll still was not determined. Officially, estimates of the dead ranged as high as 35. The 27 known dead figures was announced by army officers.

The last four cars of the troop train were telescoped by the impact of the collision. The wreckage was in such a tangle that observers could not determine the construction of the wreckage.

Of the 41 injured, army officers said 20 were critically hurt. They were taken to hospitals at Coshocton, Cambridge, Dover, Drexelton and an improvised hospital in Coshocton.

Maj. George Ford of the Ohio military district said he had not been determined who will notify the next of kin of the dead and injured. The troops were heading for Camp Atterbury, Ind., and federal service.
